Empowering academic success and learning through comprehensive advising that encourages strategic thinking, engagement, and accountability.

Definition of Advising:

At Appalachian State University, academic advising is defined as a collaborative learning and teaching process that empowers students to explore, articulate and achieve their academic, career and life goals. Advising at Appalachian offers students the opportunity to build an interpersonal relationship with their advisor for the purpose of promoting self-efficacy for success at the university and beyond. Both student and advisor are responsible for ensuring that this is a successful partnership.

ADVISOR/STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

The relationship between that of an advisor and student is one of shared responsibility. A great partnership can be formed between both parties when guidelines are set forth to clarify roles and responsibilities.

Be available during regular office hours and scheduled appointment times	Schedule an appointment in advance and show up on time to meet with your faculty advisor at least once a semester
Support student in strategizing future personal/professional goals and formulating an academic plan	Thoroughly review and understand the Program of Study, Four-Year Guide, and DegreeWorks to ensure timely graduation
Remain updated and educate student regarding institutional policies and procedures, important academic dates, and major/minor requirements. Share resources on how to use student systems. Seek assistance and ask questions if unsure	Learn how to utilize university and college websites to search for policies and procedures, program requirements, and the academic calendar. Learn how to self-register for classes, view your academic status, and track your progress towards graduation
Holistically review student course recommendations, explain progress to graduation, recommend key strategies for program success, provide honest feedback, and document notes of advising session in DegreeWorks to be reviewed by the student	Prepare for your advising appointment by reviewing courses offered next semester and creating a mock schedule. Be ready to take notes and discuss how your chosen courses relate to your academic and professional goals
Instill in student the ability to develop critical and rational thinking skills to effectively solve problems and provide viable solutions	Ask questions if you are unsure how courses impact your future, if you are unclear about academic policies, or have concerns
Assist student to understand the purpose and goals of higher education and aid in exploring interest and abilities related to the students chosen academic program	Utilize campus resources to cultivate skills, build networks, overcome challenges and implement strategies to reach your academic, personal and professional goals
Actively listen to student concerns, respect individual values and choices, empower students to make informed decisions, and refer to campus services and organizations if necessary	Notify your professor and advisor immediately if you are experiencing academic or personal difficulties that are impacting your coursework
Provide accurate relevant information regarding curriculum, program requirements and co-curricular opportunities to engage learning outside of the classroom	Take ownership and be held accountable for your academic actions or inactions
Maintain confidentiality of student records according to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)	Check your Appalachian email address daily and communicate with your advisor as needed
